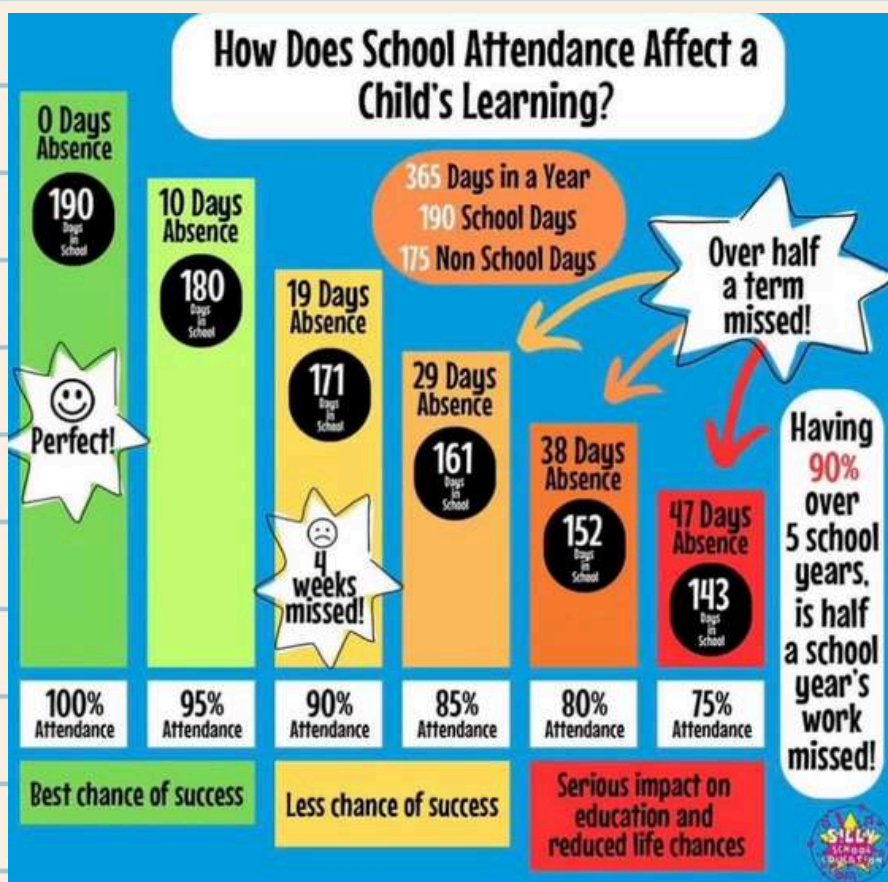

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have had a nice week! This week I wanted to discuss attendance and how important it is that children are in school to ensure their learning is not disrupted. We understand that children (like adults) do get ill from time to time but please send children in if possible - if you are unsure please ring the school office for advice. At Bandon Hill we celebrate Attendance in the following ways...

- Celebration Assembly - Every Friday we reveal which classes have had the best attendance.
- End of term Attendance Certificates for children who have 97% or more attendance for the term.
- KS2 free cinema trips for the two classes with the highest attendance (the next visit is in March!)
- Our end of term 'Attendance Award' where all children's number of unbroken weeks (weeks without an absence) are counted and for each unbroken week the child gets a 'ticket'. We then have a prize draw live in assembly where one child in KS1 and one child in KS2 win a £25 gift voucher - and so do their parents! Last term the winners who were announced in the last assembly of the year were Karter in Owens class and Junaid in Hawking class - well done! The next draw will be the week before the Easter break.

Good attendance is one of the key factors that ensures children have a successful time in primary school. The National Curriculum has been designed since 2013 to be a 'Mastery Curriculum'. This means that the children's learning is structured in a way that they master key concepts fully in depth before moving on to the next stage, including from one year to the next. This means if children have poor attendance, gaps in their knowledge and skills will occur and become wider as their time in school progresses. This chart shows the impact of even small incidents of absence.



As you can see, more than 19 days absence in the school year would be 90% and the equivalent of 4 weeks work missed. For a 'mastery curriculum' such as the one we use at Bandon Hill, lessons are planned sequentially to build a child's understanding of a topic in logical steps. This means that missed sessions can mean it is difficult for children to catch up. Under 90% attendance is classed as 'persistent' absence which means the child's education can be severely disrupted. 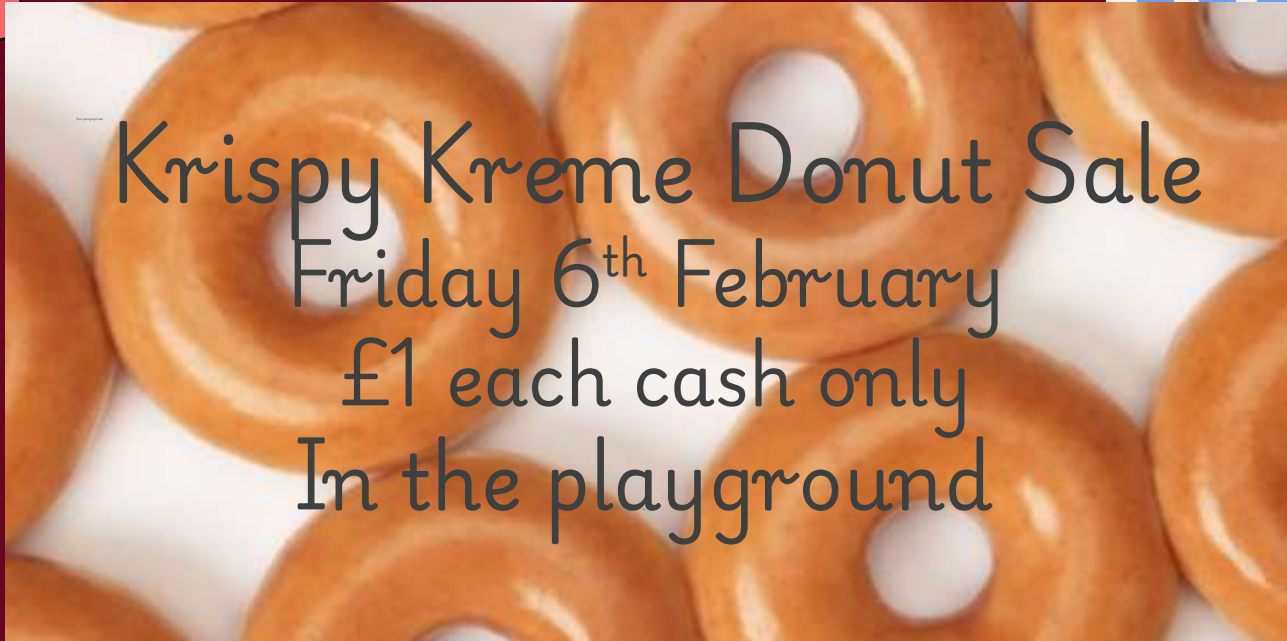

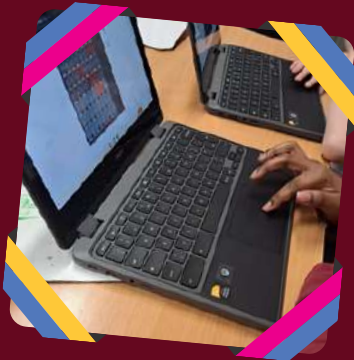

UPDATE - EYFS

N We have really enjoyed our week in Nursery, the children have loved learning about the story 'Jack and the Beanstalk' They especially enjoyed joining in with the story and shouting 'Fee, Fi, Fo, Fum!' R We have had an amazing week in Reception reading our story 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. All the children created their own bear face, tasted porridge and put some pictures into the correct size order. Next week, our focus book is 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'. We will be exploring story maps and using our imaginations to re-tell the story.

In phonics, the children are picking up our phase 3 sounds well. We would like to ask you at home to get involved with this too. You could complete a phonics tricky word hunt or sound hunt around your home or blending practice is great for helping your child read. Please use the Little Wandle website to support you with this.

In maths, the children are really understanding creating numbers in different ways well. At home you could create a number hunt, use objects that the children can count with you to really embed this practice.

Year 1 are really enjoying their foundation subjects this week. We did observations of our environment in Science. We looked at what has happened to the trees and what will happen in the future. We then painted a tree for each season. When walking around with your child, get them to tell you what seasonal changes they can see.

In History, we completed a timeline of toys from over 100 years ago to the 21st century! We were so surprised to see how toys were 100 years old.

In Music, we are using fairy tales stories to explore and experiment with our voice. For example, in the 'Three Little Pigs' story, what would the Wolf sound like? How would each of the Little Pigs sound? To encourage your child at home, practise reading stories and changing your voice.

We've had a busy week this week in Year 2! At the start of the week in Science, the children were investigating micro-habitats in the playground. Next week, we will be learning about food chains.

In maths, the children have continued their learning of 3d shapes and have begun to create patterns using a range of shapes. Next week, we are moving onto money. Do you have any change they can look at to help them count coins and notes?

In English, the children have really enjoyed writing their own Tinga Tinga tale. Some have even come up with an original story and they have all worked hard to include some fantastic vocabulary.

We are looking forward to our drumming working on Wednesday 4th February and the children are excited to show you some of the things we've been learning about during our Class Assembly on the 11th!

Another wonderful week of learning for our Year 3s this week. We are really getting into our Egyptian topic now and it's been wonderful to see some children bring in extra work they have done at home to share with the class!

This week in English we have been learning about Howard Carter's discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb in 1922. We are getting ready to start writing our own newspaper articles next week. Our history has focussed on the River Nile and why this was so important to the Ancient Egyptians. We have also been practising our weaving skills ready to weave our own Egyptian baskets in Design and Technology.

If you are interested in the Ancient Egyptians there are lots of online resources you could have a look at at home. For example, the British Museum website has a section on their Egyptian collection (<https://www.britishmuseum.org/collection/egypt>) which has interesting facts and photographs of some of the artefacts they have. If you had time and fancied a trip to London at the weekend you could go and have a look round their collection and see the artefacts in real life! It has been an incredibly productive and focused week for Year 5!

In Maths, the children have been focusing on the 'bus stop' method for division, including looking at questions that would end with a remainder.

We have also held important sessions in PSHE this week, where we discussed the various physical and emotional changes that occur during puberty. The children approached this topic with great maturity and respect, asking thoughtful questions as they learn more about how their bodies grow and change.

Our classrooms have also been filled with rhythm and soul as we continue our 'Blues' topic in Music. This week, the children have been learning the structure of the 12-bar blues, and it has been a joy to see them engaging so enthusiastically with the genre's unique sound. To support their learning at home, you might enjoy listening to some classic Blues artists together—such as B.B. King or Muddy Waters—and seeing if your child can spot the repeating 12-bar pattern!

Nurture Update



This week in Nurture, we have been exploring the "big feelings" that make us human, with a focus on understanding anger.

After listening to *When I Am Angry* by Michael Gordon, the children used writing and drawing to identify their personal triggers and describe how anger feels within their bodies and minds.

In our other groups, we focused on communication strategies for when we feel upset, shy, or anxious. We practiced finding our voices in difficult moments and explored creative outlets such as drawing pictures or creating comic strips, for those times when words are hard to find.

Additionally, some groups participated in sensory circuits, "registering" their moods both before and after the session. It was wonderful to see the children express the differences in how they felt after the movement, as well as hearing them confidently share their favourite and least favourite activities.



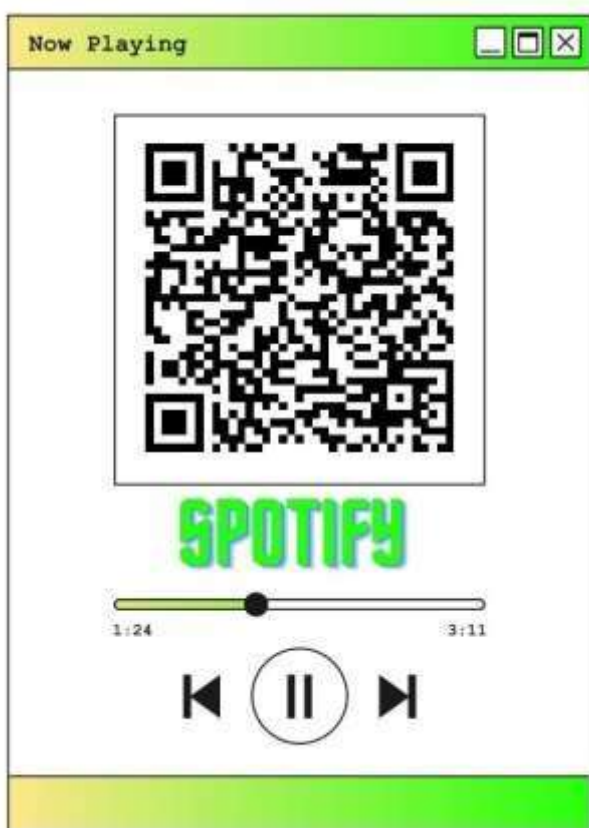
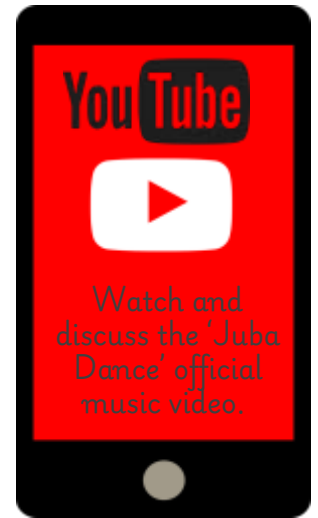

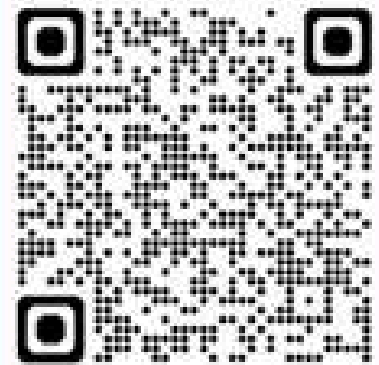
